

A weekly round-up from each class

NURSERY ENGLAND

This week Nursery have had some very exciting guests. The children have loved waiting for our eggs to hatch and looking after them in the room. Our book this week has been The Odd Egg, where we have been exploring the importance of being a kind friend and learning how to look after our ducks. We have been looking at lifecycles and continuing to find out about the signs of spring. Our tadpoles are also still growing, but we've had to send Miss Thomas out in the rain to get them some more pond water...we MUST look after our animals! We now know lots about amphibians, reptiles and birds.

RECEPTION ITALY

This week Reception have been reading 'The Tiny Seed'. We have created a beautiful flower which mimics the front cover of the book. We have been writing lovely sentences about the seeds blowing in the wind! We used our 'ee' and 'ai' digraphs in our sentences and capital letter, finger spaces and full stops. In maths we have been working on our number bonds to 10. To top off our exciting week we saw the ducklings swim for the first time!

1 AUSTRALIA

An exciting week for 1 Australia as this week we got to do our sharing assembly to our grown-ups and the whole school. Everyone did super well and worked hard on their part - a big well done from Miss Price and Mrs Grey! In English we have designed story maps this week all about Puffin Peter. In maths we have been exploring how to make the same total in different ways and everyone has given this 100%. Our geography lessons this week have been very exciting as we were using photographs to compare Sydney and Kimpton. Have a brilliant weekend Year 1!

2 KENYA

This week Year 2 have been busy working on descriptive writing. They have been using the setting of Rapunzel to think of adventurous adjectives. They have also been learning about turning regular and irregular verbs into the past tense. Next we will be writing a descriptive setting in the past tense using everything we have learnt. In PE we started learning how to skip, it has been tricky! We have shown real resilience and have given it a great go! Well done Year 2!

3 BRAZIL

This week Year 3 had an exciting science workshop creating structures from bamboo canes. In art they made their own collagraph using different textures with cardboard, foam, rice and bubble wrap. The prints look fantastic! During English this week we have worked in groups researching the wildlife of the River Amazon and preparing a presentation. Maths this week has been learning different multiplication strategies.

4 EGYPT

This week, Year 4 have continued to investigate states of matter in a very practical way. From learning songs to role play, to creating a model sized water cycle of their own, the children have fully immersed themselves in the processes of condensation, evaporation and precipitation. Elsewhere, the class have been exploring tints of colour using powder paints, investigating how to gradually darken and lighten colour.

5 MEXICO

Our blocked subject this week has been history where we have started to discover about the Shang Dynasty. We've made timelines showing when the Shang were around, compared them to other early civilisations such as the Ancient Sumer or Indus Valley and located the area they settled in and discussed the reasons why. In maths we have been discovering 3D shapes, their properties and working out what a net of a cube could look like. In English we have started planning our next big piece of writing - a newspaper report about the goings on in our book, The Promise.

6 INDIA

This has been a super week, with exciting workshops to celebrate British Science Week and multiple sporting events. We have started our Computing unit, planning text-based adventures based on fairy tales. We are looking forward to completing these "choose your own ending" stories and sharing them with our buddies. Our maths work this week has involved exploring and calculating angles, and in English we are reading modern fairy tales in Blackberry Blue by Jamila Gavin.
